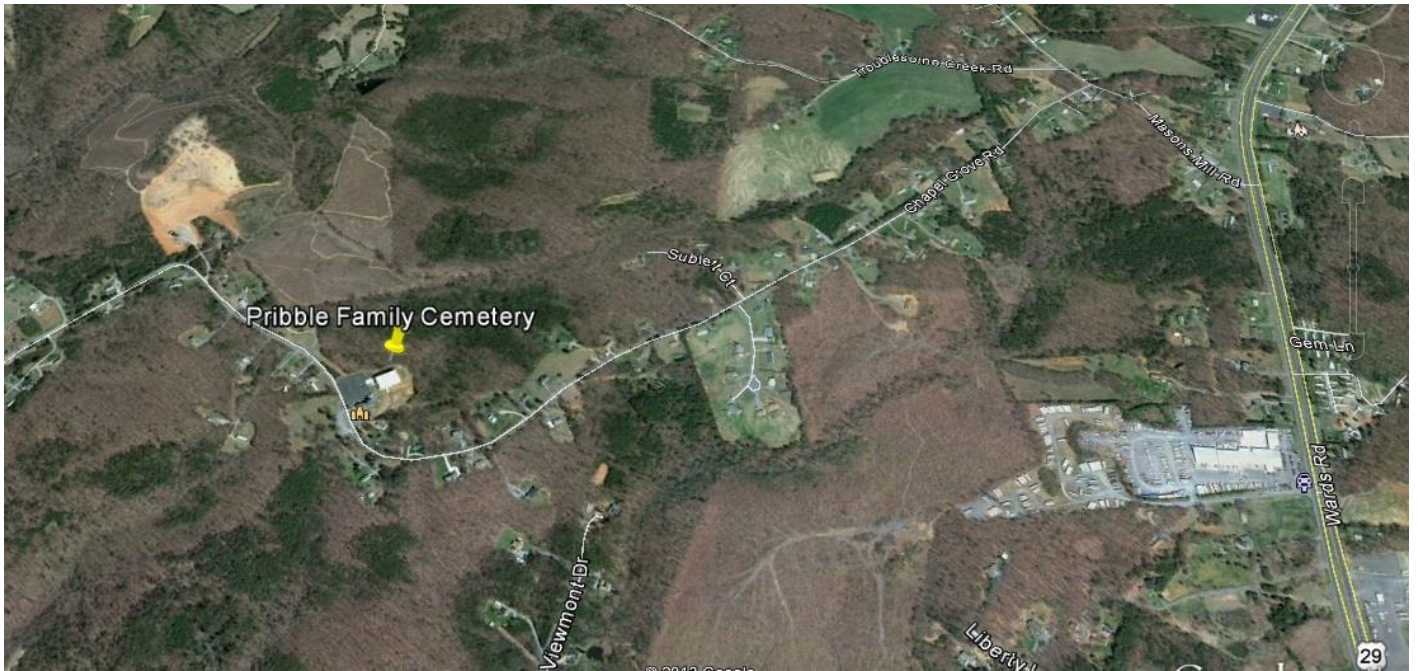

PRIBBLE FAMILY CEMETERY AT TROUBLESOME CREEK #699

The Pribble Family Cemetery at Troublesome Creek, in the Castle Craig quadrant of Campbell County, is on the northeast side of Chapel Grove Road (Route 693). From Route 29, go 3.5 miles south of Route 24. Turn west onto Mason's Mill Road (Route 692) and continue 0.2 miles. Turn left onto Chapel Grove Road and continue 1.15 miles. On your right will be Chapel Grove Church. Park in the lot.

With the church on your right, and facing the new Community Center, go to the corner of the parking lot and walk down the left edge of the grass between the Community Center and the woods. As you near the corner of the Community Center you will see the cemetery, visible only in winter. This cemetery has returned to nature with large trees, saplings and undergrowth. The most recent burials were in 1977. There are approximately 53 marked graves the remainder are unmarked. Many of the marked graves have unscripted fieldstone markers. By all accounts, this is the burial site of John Prebble, Revolutionary War Veteran, my G-G-G-Great Grandfather. His grave is obviously not marked, The marked grave of John T. Pribble is his son, a Civil War Veteran.

It is likely that my G-Great Grandmother Lucinda Prebble is also buried here, as well as her Father James Prebble, son of Rev. War Vet. John Prebble.
